Mr. Anthony is an international consultant and New York City educator in the area of peace management, youth leadership and community building.

His experiences led him to want to create a world where other children would not have such experiences. He is a graduate student at Georgetown University with a concentration on Foreign Policy and International Security, and a keynote speaker at the UN and numerous universities.



Joe Ritacco will moderate the panel discussion. While a computer scientist at Bell Labs, Joe spent two years in Iran. Since his recent retirement he has focused on interfaith and intercultural dialogue and peace-making.
